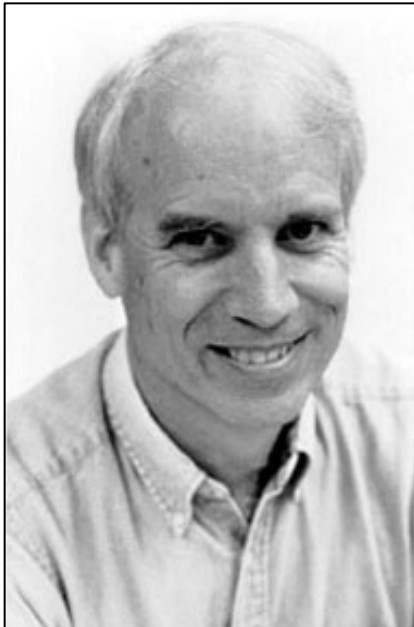

Professor Burlingame has completed work on numerous Lincoln-inspired books including a two-volume biography of Lincoln (John Hopkins University Press, 2008) and *The Inner World of Abraham Lincoln* (University of Illinois Press, 1994). In 1997, he published *Inside Lincoln's White House: The Complete Civil War Diary of John Hay* (Southern Illinois University Press). In 1998, he published *Lincoln Observed: Civil War Dispatches of Noah Brooks* (Johns Hopkins University Press), *Lincoln's Journalist: John Hay's Anonymous Writings for the Press 1860-1864* (Southern Illinois University Press) and an expanded edition of Walter B. Stevens' *A Reporter's Lincoln* (University of Nebraska Press.) Dr. Burlingame is also on the board of directors of the Abraham Lincoln Association (Springfield, IL.) and the Abraham Lincoln Institute (Washington, D.C.). He also serves on the board of advisors for the Abraham Lincoln Studies Center at Knox College (Galesburg, IL.). In addition, his work is often featured on the History Channel and other related educational venues.
