**Transfer Students who have activity classes on their transcripts should understand that these courses do not count toward credit for the bachelor's degree. Transfer students from an Oklahoma Junior or Community College have met the General Education requirements for the most part. Depending on bachelor's degree program requirements, transfer students may need to enroll in lower division or general education coursework to satisfy the specific bachelor's degree program requirements. For example, a transfer student who plans to major in Social Science Education must have completed all required lower division courses for the degree regardless of whether the student has completed an Associate's Degree.**
