

Staff Satisfaction Results

- Almost 77% of respondents pointed out that they think NWOSU will change for the better in the next five years!
- Over 81% of participants agreed that Northwestern values each individual as part of a diverse community.
- 86.31% stated that they would recommend NWOSU as a good place to work.
- ➤ Approximately 79% respondents indicated that NWOSU seeks to support each employee in a respectful way to reach his/her life goals and full potential.
- Just shy of 90% of all respondents noted that they are proud to be part of NWOSU.


ETS Proficiency Profile Another assessment administered on Assessment Day is the Education Testing Services (ETS) Proficiency Profile, which assesses four core skill areas - critical thinking, Reading, writing and mathematics. Each spring, this test is administered to students who have completed 40-75 hours at Northwestern Oklahoma State University (NWOSU). In 2014, there were 185 students who completed this test. The total scores range from 400-500 and the overall mean score for 2014 cohort was 441.


Proficiency

The primary feature of this test is to measure proficiency. ETS identified levels of proficiency in reading, writing, mathematics and critical thinking. The chart below shows the proficiency in each area measured. As you can see, NWOSU's strong areas lie in Reading, Level 1, Writing, Level 1 and Mathematics, Level 1. The areas with more room for improvement are critical thinking, Writing, Level 3 and mathematics,

Not only does the ETS
Proficiency Profile allow
NWOSU to see its own areas
of strengths and weaknesses,
but it also provides NWOSU
with comparative data from
over SO comparable
universities. According to the
data provided, the chart

above shows the areas of proficiency in relation to the comparable universities. The comparative data chart shows that NWOSU ranks higher than the mean proficiency score from comparable universities in all areas except Critical Thinking.
