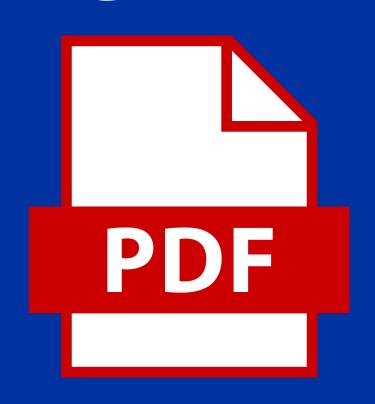

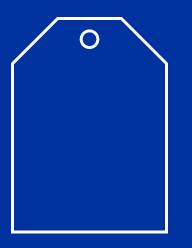

#### Step-by-Step Accessibility Check

**Open the PDF** in Adobe **Acrobat Pro DC** 

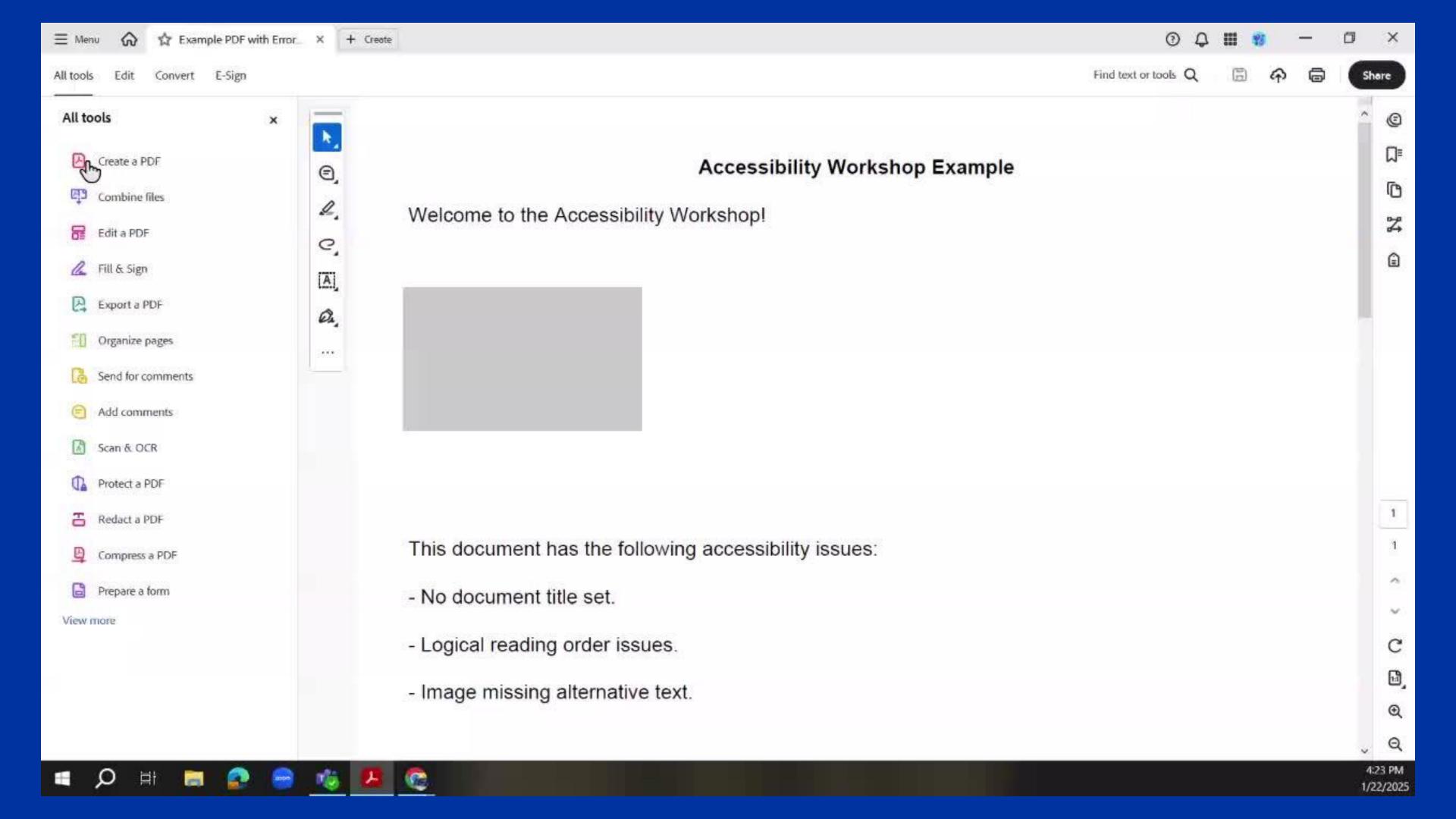

Run Accessibility
Check:
All Tools > Prepare
for Accessibility >
Check for
Accessibility.
Make sure the option
"Document is tagged
PDF" is selected

Review Accessibility
Checker (Right menu)
Sidebar lists issues.
Right click for details.
Check security of the
document as this can
interfere with screen
readers. Fix
permission flag to "no

security" if necessary.



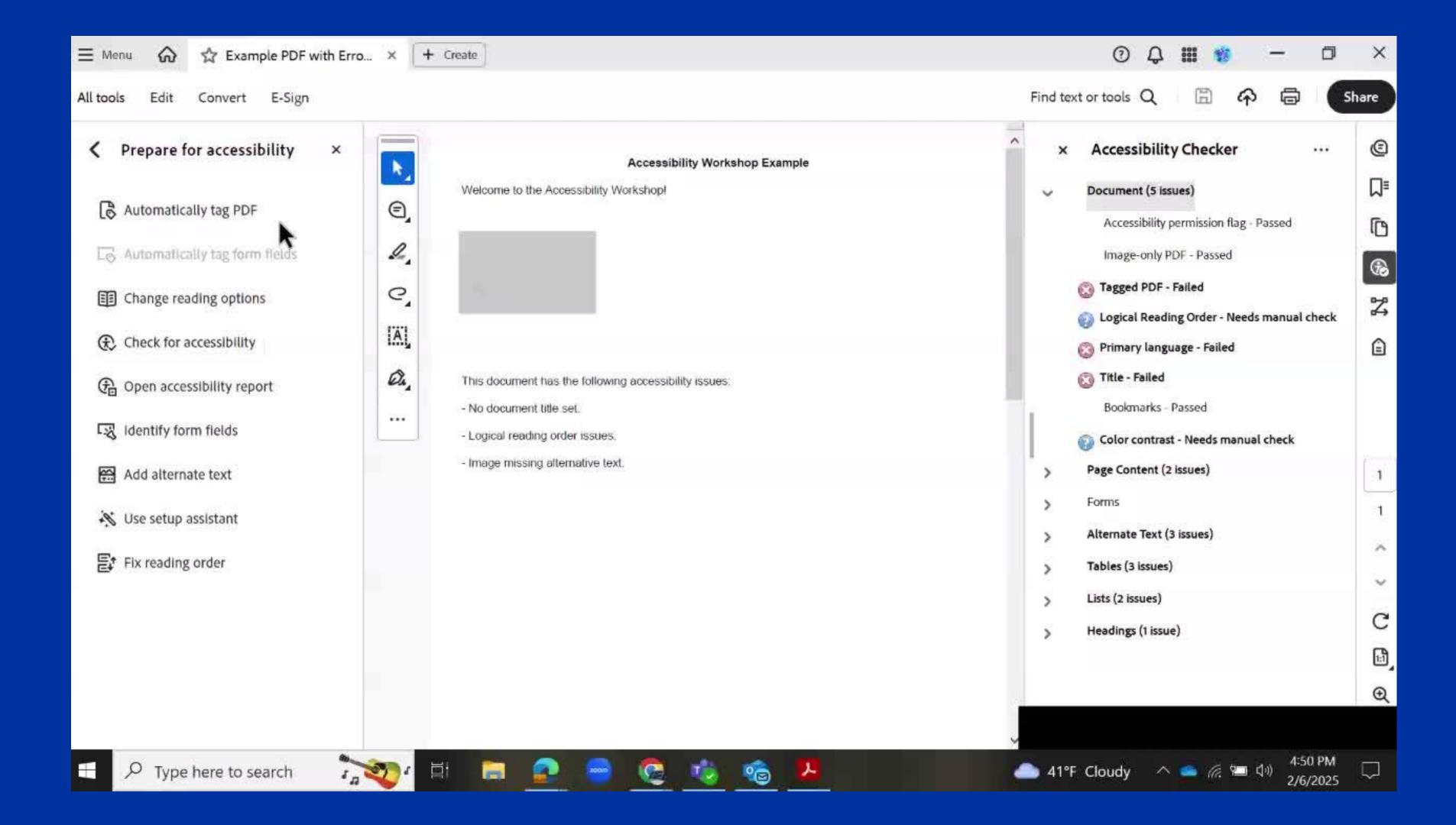
# Basic Remediation Techniques (Part 1)

#### Tagging

- If this rule check fails, the document isn't tagged to specify the correct reading order.
- From the "All tools" menu select "Prepare for Accessibility.
- Select "Automatically tag PDF".
- Review the Tag Tree to the right of the screen.

#### Reading Order

- Select "Fix Reading Order"
- Select "Show Order Panel"
- This opens a tool that lets you visually reorder elements by dragging and numbering them.



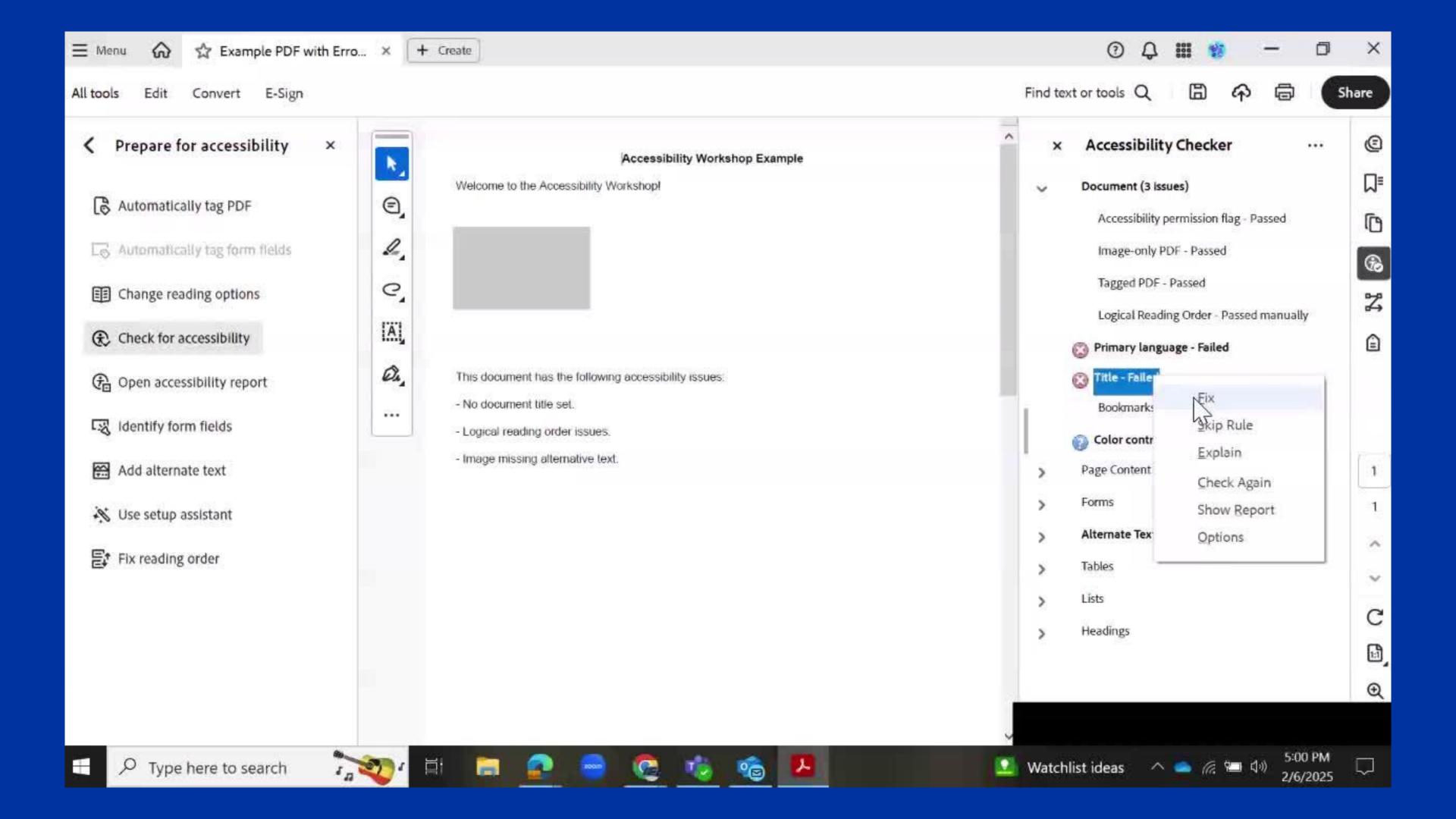
# Basic Remediation Techniques (Part 2)

#### Add a Title

- Right click on "Title" in the Accessibility Checker tab.
- Choose "Fix" from the Options menu.
- Deselect "Leave As Is" (if necessary).
- Enter the document title in the Description box.

#### Add Alternative Text

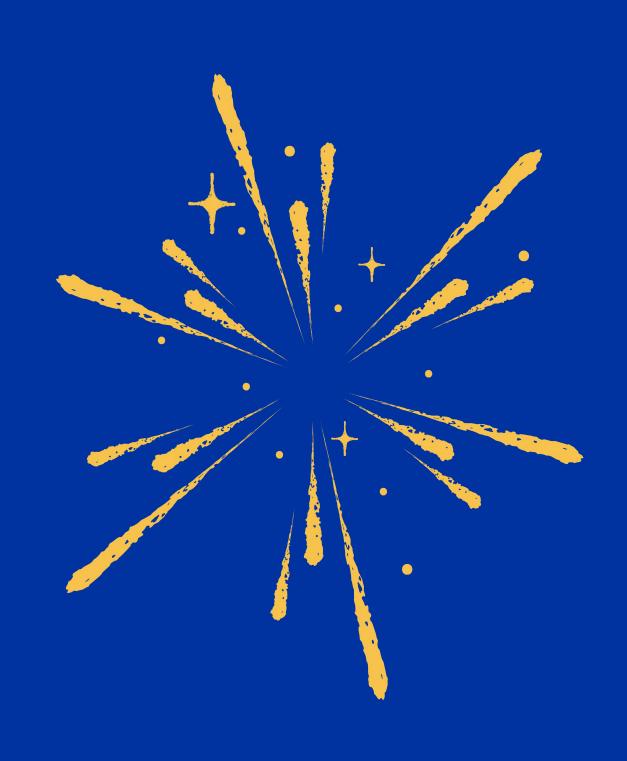
- In the Accessibility Checker tab click the dropdown for "Alternate Text"
- Right click on "Figures Alternative Text".
- Either mark as decorative, or enter a brief description of the image content.



#### Final Step

"passed"

Run the accessibility
check again and make
sure everything in the
accessibility checker has
