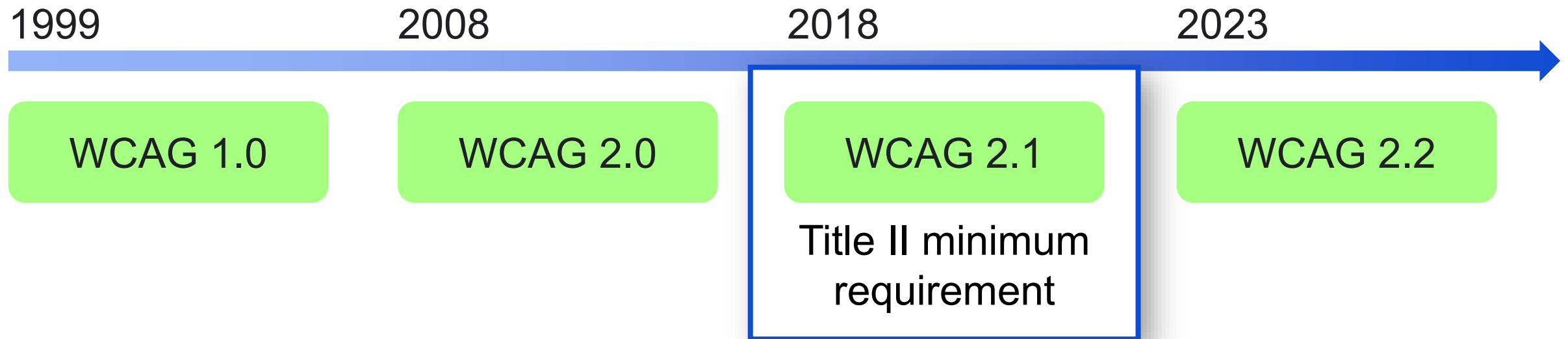

Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)



WCAG 3.0 is in the works – will **not** be usable for many years

WCAG Levels



A

Issues that block a user from content or tasks



AA

Issues that create a negative or inefficient experience, often leading to confusion



AAA

Issues that are above and beyond minimum legal standard but benefit comprehension and usability

Archival Content & Documents

Archived web content and documents do not require remediation if:

- Created before the rule compliance date
- Reproduces paper or physical media
- Kept for reference only
- Located in a special area for archived content
- Content has not been changed

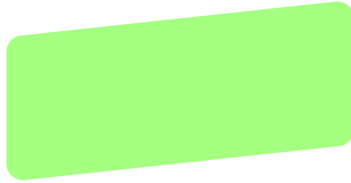

- Document is about a specific person, property, or account
- Are password-protected or otherwise secured

Remediation Strategies

PDF Remediation Strategy

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Remove the outdated
& unnecessary

- Outdated or inaccurate
- No longer needed
- Redundant

Identify archivable

- No updates
- Process for someone to request an accessible version
- If updated needs to be brought into compliance

Convert to HTML

- “Does this need to be a document?”

Remediate

- Highest impact first
- Most utilized

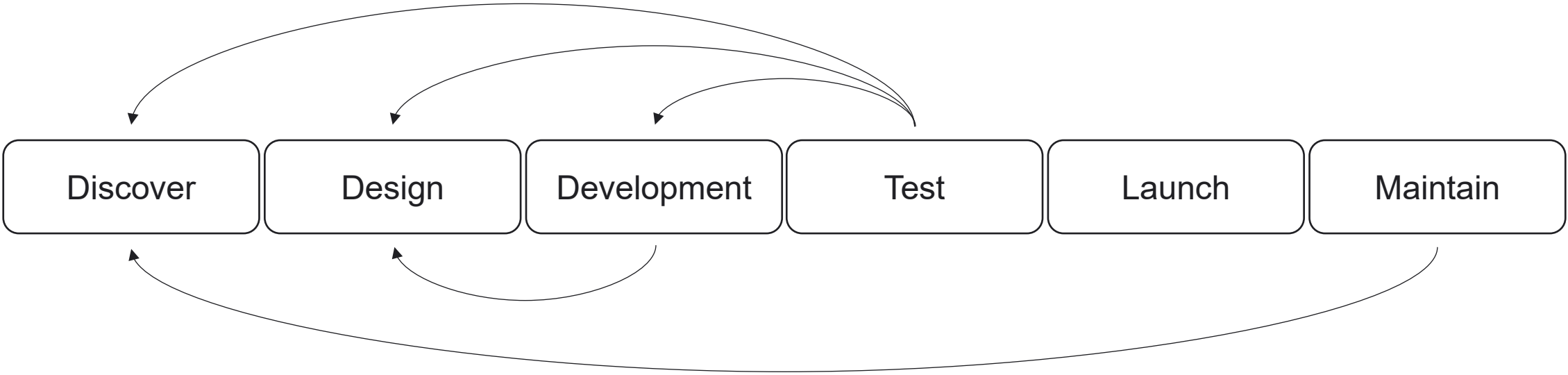
