



## **ETS Proficiency Profile Results**

The Education Testing Services (ETS) Proficiency Profile assesses four core skill areas – critical thinking, reading, writing and mathematics. Each spring, this test is administered to students who have completed 40-75 hours at Northwestern Oklahoma State University (NWOSU). In 2023, there were 91 students who completed this test. The total scores range from 400-500 and the overall mean score for the 2023 cohort was 439.20.

## **Proficiency**


The primary feature of this test is to measure proficiency. ETS identifies levels of proficiency in reading, writing, mathematics and critical thinking. The chart to the left shows the




proficiency in each
area measured. As
you can see from the
chart to the left,
NWOSU's strongest
areas lie in Writing
Level 1, Reading
Level 1, and

Mathematics Level 1. The areas with more room for improvement are Critical Thinking, Mathematics Level 3, and Writing Level 3.

The chart below shows the trends of change over the past 5 years. As you can see from the data, NWOSU continues to improve in all areas. The data gained from the ETS Proficiency Profile helps to show where NWOSU is doing well and where continued improvement needs to happen.



Not only does the ETS Proficiency Profile allow NWOSU to see its own areas of strengths and weaknesses, but it also provides NWOSU with comparative data from over 50 comparable universities. According to the data provided, the chart below shows the areas of proficiency in relation to the comparable universities. The comparative data chart shows that



NWOSU scored equal to or higher than the mean proficiency score from comparable universities in all areas except for Writing Level 2, and Writing Level 3,
