The Division of Nursing's conceptual framework includes the concept of cultural diversity and it is threaded throughout every course in both the undergraduate (traditional BSN and Online RN-to-BSN) and graduate (BSN-to-DNP) programs.

<u>Traditional BSN students</u>: All clinical experiences occur in communities throughout NW Oklahoma (Alva, Enid, Woodward, Ponca City and surrounding areas). Students work with clients across the life-span in the community. Experiences are included in Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), hospitals, clinics, schools, and home settings in rural areas. <u>BSN-to-DNP Students</u>: Beginning in Spring 2019, students were placed in rural health clinics, federally qualified safety net clinics and correctional facilities for clinical practicums. <u>Online RN-to-BSN Students</u>: Students conduct interviews with clients in rural communities as well as with providers of social services in communities.

## Explanation of how department provides support for or outreach to underserved, minority, or socio-economically disadvantaged students.

The Division of Nursing admits traditional and non-traditional students to all of its programs. We have students in every program for whom English is the second language. We have numerous students throughout the programs who are single parents, sole breadwinners, gender minorities in the profession, and are first generation students. We personalize advisement to provide accessible support in face-to-face meetings, by phone, ZOOM meetings and email to promote student retention when they are challenged with juggling work, education and family commitments. The Division also has identified a faculty member as the "Student Success Coordinator" who works 1:1 with the traditional BSN students to help them with strategies for success in the rigorous nursing program.

The Division of Nursing uses a "blind" process for admission of students to its programs. The Division actively recruits potential students from Oklahoma and neighboring students. Applicant admission materials are then de-identified for Admission Committee review and the faculty review processes. This process helps to eliminate any cultural bias that otherwise could potentially be introduced into the selection process.
