The students in these classes selected 8 different female leaders combined for of both semesters. The students also selected 10 leaders of color for the combined semesters.

- Student organization (Rangers Business Club) activities
 - In the Spring of 2021 the Rangers Business Club held a joint Blood Drive with the Nursing club on April 20-21, 2021.
- The Division of Business Scholarship Committee met in March 2020 to make recommendations to the Financial Aid Office for the recipients of Business and Accounting major scholarships for AY 2020–2021.
