

Faculty Development Advisory Board Minutes for September 27, 2019

Mission Statement: FDAB seeks to support and offer enrichment opportunities for Northwestern faculty who are empowered by their own initiative and desire to provide the highest quality educational experiences for students.

FDAB met in IE 128 and E 229 with others participating via Zoom; the following items were discussed.

- I. 2019-2020 Board Members: T. Brown shared names of board members and welcomed new and returning members to the board.
- II. 2019-2020 Orientation for New Faculty: No additions or changes to the orientation (that took place on August 13 and August 14) were shared at this time. T. Brown asked board members to check with new faculty in their departments/divisions for any feedback and to email any suggestions or concerns to her.
- III. August 2019 FD Day: The first day back on Friday, August 16, 2019, was scheduled differently from previous years. Faculty development sessions were added to the day, so the board members discussed and provided feedback on the faculty development-related aspects of the day. The sessions were described as "valuable" and "informative." The board members agreed that the faculty development-related elements were successfully and support the continuation of having faculty development sessions as part of the first day back as long as the topics addressed/sessions remain meaningful. T. Brown will share the board's feedback with Dr. Bell.
- IV. Faculty Development and Resource Center:
 - S. Leaper reported that the printer must be unplugged in order to plug in and use the conference center equipment. She has contacted IT to find out what needs to be done to fix this issue.
 - T. Brown asked board members to remind the faculty and students in their departments/divisions about use of the center as well as the laptops and webcams that are available to be checked out through the library check-out system.
 - T. Brown previously worked with IT to develop a reservation system for the center that is through Outlook. The system allows any faculty member to view the availability of the center and to make a reservation. Parts of the process are a little tricky, so she has developed a list of instructions for how to check for the center's availability and create a

reservation of the center. She asked for volunteers to work through the instructions and determine if they make sense and take care of all steps of the processes. S. Leaper and L. Collins both offered to do it. T. Brown will email the instructions to them. T. Brown will make adaptations based on feedback. Once it is determined that the instructions are as needed, T. Brown will email them to all faculty.

V. 2019-2020 Faculty Development Events and Resources: 20-Minute Mentor Series: The 2018-2019 board offered the 20-Minute Mentor series, Engaging Modern Learners, in spring 2019; feedback received was positive, so the plan was made to offer a series addressing student attention and retention in spring 2020. The board agreed to offer the series in the same manner as the last series including it being offered via ITV and each of the three sessions being offered twice to potentially allow more faculty to attend. T. Brown will be in touch via email to schedule dates for the sessions and to figure out facilitators for each of the spring 2020 sessions. <u>FD Blackboard Site</u>: T. Brown shared that she continues to update the Blackboard site with updated and new resources. FDAB previously discussed adding videos from the orientation; however, recording the orientation sessions has not yet been started. There's some concern that it will be difficult to carry this out due to the organization of the orientation and the various places the sessions are held.

T. Brown will contact FDAB members to continue planning of the 20-Minute Mentor series via email. Board members will be contacted to schedule the next face-to-face meeting in spring 2020.
