According to federal financial aid regulations, you are considered a dependent student and will need to include our parent's income and asset information on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) unless you meet one or more of the following conditions:

In *unusual circumstances*, an aid administrator can determine that a student who does not meet any of the above criteria should still be considered an independent student. Four conditions that do not gualify as *unusual circumstances* or that do not merit a dependency override are:

- 1. Parents refuse to contribute to the student's education.
- 2. Parents are unwilling to provide information on the FAFSA or verification documents.
- 3. Parents did not claim the student as a dependent for income tax purposes.
- 4. Student demonstrates total self-sufficiency.

	two or more acceptable sources of documentation listed above in number 1.

	a. Complete copies of your marriage license and divorce decree
	b. Signed and notarized statement from your parents verifying amounts of financial support of any kind (other than reasonable
	gifts for birthdays and holidays) or the absence of such support after you married.
4.	All must submit the following verification items: a. A 2017-2018 Independent Verification Form
	b. A 2017-2018 Student Resource and Expense Certification
	c. A copy of your 2015 IRS Tax Return Transcript (if you filed a 2015 return), available at <u>www.irs.gov</u>
	d. A copy of a current lease agreement or rental contract
